What does PSHE coverage look like in EYFS?



PSHE

We are developing our PSHE through...

Personal, Social Emotional Development

3 / 4 year olds:

- Select and use activities and resources, with help when needed. This helps them to achieve a goal they have chosen or one which is suggested to them.
- Develop their sense of responsibility and membership of a community.
- Become more outgoing with unfamiliar people, in the safe context of their setting.
- Show more confidence in new social situations.
- Play with one or more other children, extending and elaborating play ideas.
- Help to find solutions to conflicts and rivalries. For example, accepting that not everyone can be Spider-Man in the game, and suggesting other ideas.
- Increasingly follow rules, understanding why they are important.
- Do not always need an adult to remind them of a rule. - Develop appropriate ways of being assertive.

Communication and Language

3 / 4 year olds:

- Be able to express a point of view and to debate when they disagree with an adult or friend, using words as well as actions.
- Can start a conversation with an adult or a friend and continue it for many turns.

Reception:

- Use talk to help work out problems and organise thinking and activities, explain how things work and why they might happen.
- Develop social phrases.

ELG: C&L: Listening, attention and understanding:

 Hold conversation when engaged in back-and-forth exchanges with their teachers and peers.

Physical Development

3 / 4 year olds:

- Starting to eat independently and learning how to use a knife and fork. - Be increasingly independent as they get dressed and undressed. For example, putting coats on and doing up zips.
- Be increasingly independent in meeting their own care needs, e.g. brushing teeth, using the toilet, washing and drying their hands thoroughly.
- Make healthy choices about food, drink, activity and toothbrushing.

Reception:

 Know and talk about the different factors that support their overall health and wellbeing: regular physical activity, healthy eating, toothbrushing, sensible

Understanding the World

3 / 4 year olds:

- Begin to make sense of their own lifestory and family's history.
- Show interest in different occupations.
- Continue to develop positive attitudes about the differences between people.
- Know that there are different countries in the world and talk about the differences they have experienced or seen in photos.

Reception:

- Talk about members of their immediate family and community.
- Name and describe people who are familiar to them Recognise that people have different beliefs and celebrate special times in different ways.

ELG: UTW: Past and Present:

 Talk about the lives of people around them and their roles in society

- Talk with others to solve conflicts.
- Talk about their feelings using words like 'happy', 'sad', 'angry' or 'worried'.
- Begin to understand how others might be feeling.

Reception:

- See themselves as a valuable individual.
 Build constructive and respectful relationships.
- Express their feelings and consider the feelings of others.
- Show resilience and perseverance in the face of challenge.
- Identify and moderate their own feelings socially and emotionally.
- Think about the perspectives of others.
- Manage their own needs.

ELG: PSED: Self Regulation:

- Show an understanding of their own feelings and those of others, and begin to regulate their behaviour accordingly.
- Set and work towards simple goals, being able to wait for what they want and control their immediate impulses when appropriate.
- Give focused attention to what the teacher says, responding appropriately even when engaged in activity, and

ELG: C&L: Speaking:

 Express their ideas and feelings about their experiences using full sentences, including use of past, present and future tenses and making use of conjunctions, with modelling and support from their teacher.

- amounts of 'screen time', having a good sleep routine, being a safe pedestrian
- Further develop the skills they need to manage the school day successfully: lining up and queuing, mealtimes, personal hygiene.

ELG: PD: Gross Motor Skills - Negotiate space and obstacles safely, with consideration for themselves and others.
